Social Justice / Outreach Activities / Charities:

Catholic Social Teachings of the Church root our actions in supporting human dignity and the preferential option of the poor which calls us to serve the most vulnerable in the world.

As a school community, we are committed to supporting those among us who are in greater need. Through our Youth and Adult Faith Ambassadors, Mental Health Team, and our Eco Team we ensure community participation in social justice activities and programs, and a particular focus on the sustainability of our environment and Diversity and Equity.

Our Youth Faith Ambassador and our Eco Team programs continue to provide students with a voice and on-going opportunities for student leadership.

Throughout the school year we are involved in social justice initiatives such as Share Life, The Mississauga Food Bank, Dr. Simone's Canadian Food for Children initiatives, St. Vincent de Paul sponsorships, Stewards of the Earth initiatives, Terry Fox Walk, etc.

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

The Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectations are highlighted daily through visual signs, announcements, whole school and classroom experiences. Teachers embed the expectations into daily curriculum learning opportunities, while modeling the same for all students. Students engage in leadership and live our Catholic values through our Youth Faith Ambassador Program, Eco Teams, Wildcat Leadership opportunities, Virtue Monthly Recognition Certificates, Social Justice initiatives and announcements. Our front foyer will become a space for displaying student-initiated work linked to our OCSGE through our Media display, and a space for highlighting our Virtues.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

The St. Edmund school community gathers regularly to focus our attention on ten virtues. The virtues are an area of daily focus through our announcements, prayers, and interactions. We celebrate our accomplishments and give thanks for God's presence in our daily lives. We highlight the Monthly Virtues in many forms, from morning announcements, virtue certificates and student recognition. The virtues we celebrate are:

Oct. - Empathy Mar. - Kindness

Nov. - Conscience Apr. - Love

Dec. - Hope May - Acceptance

Jan. - Self Control June - Fairness

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

We promote unity within our St. Edmund school community by gathering together in a variety of contexts and sharing common prayers. Prayer is experienced daily as a whole school community, as a class and as an individual. Readings are shared with the whole school. Classroom prayer is also part of dismissal routines for lunch and end of day. Teachers use sacred spaces, virtue signs, as well as faith artifacts in the classrooms, hallways and front foyer to promote our Catholic values. As a school, we are involved in many student driven social justice initiatives, eco-school projects and well-being activities (extra-curricular, prayer, liturgical, social activities and leadership experiences). Virtues Program, Family Life and Religious Education programs are integrated in curricular and extracurricular activities; the Ontario Catholic Graduate expectations are part of daily school life.

Our Youth Faith Ambassadors work together to help the students understand the gospel stories. Our YFA organize and coordinate social justice initiatives and community building events.

Our Adult Ambassadors help to enrich the spiritual lives of the adults in our school community. Our Adult Faith Team help organize Family of School Events such as the Advent Retreat and the Stations of the Cross. As well, our ambassadors organize prayer and liturgy opportunities for staff.

Our Eco Team highlights a passion for sustainability of our environment, creating school wide initiatives that inform, reflect and motivate.
